

ADAIR COUNTY COMMISSION MINUTES
MONDAY, MAY 15, 2017
6TH DAY APRIL REGULAR

The Adair County Commission convened at 8:30 a.m. on May 15, 2017 in the Courthouse at Kirksville. All Commissioners were present.

Presiding Commissioner Pickens was once again present for session. He is returning on a part-time basis until further notice from the result of an unanticipated illness. He will be present in the mornings. Commissioner Thompson will continue to be acting Presiding Commissioner during the absence of Presiding Commissioner Pickens.

At 9:00 a.m., the Adair County Commission met with representatives of the Putnam County Public Water Supply District #1 ((PC PWSD #1). Those present were Adair County Presiding Commissioner, Stanley Pickens; 1st District Commissioner, William King; 2nd District Commissioner, Mark Thompson; Adair County Road and Bridge Supervisor, Isaiah Curtis; PC PWSD #1 representative, David Lloyd; representative of Lawson Construction on behalf of the PC PWSD #1; and Greg Lawrence, representing landowner requesting water service.

David Lloyd asked for permission to use the Adair County right-of-way on Daytona Road to extend their water main. Commission King asked how they would handle any damages or repairs that would need to be completed because of the line. He also wanted to know what their policy was if the line was damaged because of road maintenance or other activities.

Mr. Lloyd said that it was Putnam County's policy to cover any costs or repairs that would arise. They had surveyed the area and the line would run eight feet under the ditch so there shouldn't be any worry of damage to the line. Mr. Lloyd supplied the Commission with a copy of the letter from the Adair County PWSD #1 giving permission to Putnam County to extend into Adair County.

Mr. Curtis had no objection as long as they repaired any damage done to the road. Commissioner Thompson made the motion to approve the request. Commissioner King seconded the motion. Presiding Commissioner Pickens, all in favor.

Mr. Lloyd said that they would email a contract for the Commission to sign in order to proceed.

Mr. Lawrence asked what the timeframe would be on the construction of the line.


Mr. Lloyd stated that the board did not meet again until June 7th in order to approve and sign the contract.

The Adair County Commission adjourned at 4:00 p.m. on May 15, 2017.
