

**ADAIR COUNTY COMMISSION MINUTES
TUESDAY, OCTOBER 31, 2017
13TH DAY OCTOBER REGULAR**

The Adair County Commission convened at 8:30 a.m. on October 31, 2017 in the Courthouse at Kirksville. All Commissioners were present. Commissioner Thompson will continue to be acting Presiding Commissioner during the absence of Presiding Commissioner Pickens.

The Commission responded to a request from Bob Bergstrom of Terra-Gen, LLC. Mr. Bergstrom was notified that Adair County does not have County zoning affecting construction/repairs of utilities; Missouri Revised Statute 229.100 is applicable. The only exception is FAA Regulatory Compliance in the proximity of the Kirksville Regional Airport.

City Council Study session 10-31-17 as reported by Commissioner King:

The Adair County Commission attended a City Council Study session at City Hall on 10-31-17 at 2:00 p.m.

Kirksville City Manager, Mary Macomber, requested that the Adair County Commission appoint an Adair County resident to the Regional Planning Commission (RPC). The RPC has monies designated for economic development for this region. City Manager Macomber suggested Carolyn Chrisman be appointed to that Commission.

City Manager Macomber asked if the Bullhead Trail agreement that she had sent had been approved. Commissioner King advised the agreement had been sent to Adair County Prosecuting Attorney, Matt Wilson, for review.

City Manager Macomber asked if we had updated our salary schedule. Commissioner King advised that the County was in the process of doing that with hopes that it would be done before the County budget was finished.

Kirksville Police/Fire Chief, Jim Hughes, brought to the attention of the County Commission that there was an intergovernmental agreement providing for auto extrication and hazardous material response services in rural Adair County by the City of Kirksville. The original agreement was signed on 03/12/96 with an addendum to the 1996 agreement on 01/22/03. Since there has been no further agreement for 14 years, he was reevaluating the agreement since there has been an increase in cost for equipment and maintenance. Chief Hughes advised he would contact the Commission later with a new proposal.

Commissioner King requested the City Council to support the County Commission in an attempt to again be able to use the animal shelter for vicious animals. The County hasn't been able to use the shelter for several years and has to take animals out of the County to house them. Mayor Phil Biston stated the City Council would do whatever they could to help out the County.
