




WHAT SURGERIES AND PROCEDURES ARE COVERED?

*NO COST VISION SCREENING BENEFIT

Employees do not need to have the GBS eye insurance plan to be eligible for this benefit!

It's true, and—even better—it's easy to use! Since there's no vision network provider required, simply visit any eye care provider you like for the screening and you're covered at 100%, up to \$100 annually.

If your chosen provider doesn't accept your insurance, then the cost of the screening will be reimbursed to you up to \$100 with proper documentation. Please contact Human Resources at (660) 234-7914 or hkelley@adaircomo.com for details are how to receive a reimbursement for your annual eye exam.

*Reimbursement amounts (up to \$100) will cover only costs associated with the "regular" eye exam. Additional tests outside of the normal eye exam are not eliqible for reimbursement.

Using this radiology benefit can be done in two (2) easy steps:

- 1. **Enhanced imaging precertification.** When the member's physician orders an MRI, PET, or CT scan, the member must pre-certify their scan by calling, or having their provider call, the pre-certification number on the back of the member's GBS plan ID card. **Managed Care Concepts Pre-certification 1(866)750-2723.**
- 2. **Appointment scheduling.** Once their prescribed radiology service has been pre-certified, the member can contact the independent, non-hospital imaging facility of their choice to schedule their radiology appointment.

Retirement Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)





What retirement benefits are available to Adair County employees?

- LAGERS (Local Government Employees Retirement System)
 - ⇒ The County pays the entire contribution of an employee's salary into the LAGERS system
- CERF (County Employees Retirement Fund)
 - ⇒ The County pays 2% of an employee's salary and the employee pays 2% of their salary into the CERF system
- 457(b) Savings Plan (administered by Empower Retirement)
 - ⇒ This is an optional retirement plan that is paid 100% by the employee
- 401(a) Savings Plan (administered by Empower Retirement)
 - ⇒ This retirement plan is tied to the employee's 457(b) plan and is funded with matched money from CERF

What does it mean to be vested?

Being vested means an employee becomes the "owner" of the retirement plan. As the plan "owner" employees will receive benefits from the plan at their time of retirement.

What is the vested periods for Adair County retirement plans?

5 years= LAGERS

8 years = CERF

0 years= 457(b) Savings Plan (the employee "owns" this plan from day one)

5 years = 401(a) Savings Plan (401(a) plans are funded solely from the matched money from CERF)

What happens if I leave County employment before I am vested?

- LAGERS (Local Government Employees Retirement System)
 - \Rightarrow Employment service credits remain in the LAGERS system
- CERF (County Employees Retirement Fund)
 - ⇒ Former employees can receive a refund of their own contributions but forfeit employment service credits
- 457(b) Savings Plan (administered by Empower Retirement)
 - ⇒ The employee owns this plan and can roll funds into another account or get contributions refunded
- 401(a) Savings Plan (administered by Empower Retirement)
 - ⇒ Any matched CERF funds are forfeited

Spring Cleaning Hacks

Dust your house with dryer sheets

Dryer sheets collect dust and leave behind a residue that actually *repels* dust, which means dust won't settle back onto the surface you just cleaned with a dryer sheet for a couple days.







Clean lampshades with a lint roller

Dusting your lamp shades just seems to put more dust onto the lamp than you're taking off.

Take a lint roller to your lampshades. It will pick up any dirt, dust, hair, or other particles that are otherwise impossible to get off.



Wash plastic shower curtains in the washing machine

Your plastic shower curtains can be washed in the washing machine just like cloth shower curtains. The only catch is that you'll want to wash the shower curtain with a couple bath towels to keep it untangled and to help it get washed evenly.





Dust the ceiling fan with a pillowcase

Put the pillowcase over the fan blade, all the way to the base of the fan, then pull back so the dust from the top of the blade falls right into the pillowcase.



Dust baseboards with a broom

Stick a rag (or pillowcase) over the head of the broom and use an elastic to secure it in place, then walk around the rooms of your house sweeping all the dust off your baseboards.





Clean garbage disposal with lemons, ice, and salt

If you have a garbage disposal in your sink you can easily clean it by sprinkling some salt in it, throwing in a few pieces of cut lemon and a couple ice cubes in and then turning the garbage disposal on.



Remove pet hair from the carpet with a squeegee

To remove pet hair from the carpets in your house, grab a shower squeegee and run it over your carpets – it will bunch all the hairs up into a ball so you can easily remove them.
