

**ADAIR COUNTY COMMISSION MINUTES
MONDAY, OCTOBER 6, 2014
2ND DAY OCTOBER REGULAR**

The Adair County Commission convened at 8:30 a.m. on October 6, 2014 in the Courthouse at Kirksville. All Commissioners were present.

The State Emergency Management Agency (SEMA) cancelled their appointment. They indicated that enough data had been accumulated to begin their report. Karen Cassmeyer of SEMA had met with Road and Bridge Supervisor, Isaiah Curtis, the previous Friday and obtained additional information at that time.

Isaiah Curtis reported that the power washer at the Road and Bridge Department needs to be replaced. Due to the cost, bids may need to be obtained. Mr. Curtis will get additional information.

Commissioner Thompson moved to proclaim November 16-22, 2014 as Geography Awareness Week with November 19, 2014 as Geographic Information Systems (GIS) Day. Commissioner Adams seconded the motion with all in favor. Geography Awareness Week promotes geo-literacy and education in the nation's schools and communities. GIS technologies are a powerful tool for supporting emergency services, homeland security, economic development, environmental protection, crime mapping, healthcare, long-range planning, and much more.

Commissioner Pickens signed an amendment to the food service agreement between Adair County Jail and CBM Managed Services. After the initial contract year, the parties may adjust the contract pricing for future years based on the Consumer Price Index "Food Away From Home Index" for the previous year.

The Commission spent the rest of the day attending to County business.

The Adair County Commission adjourned at 4:00 p.m. on October 6, 2014.
