Adair County Public Administrator, Rhonda Noe, met with the Commission to make them aware that her office in the Adair County Annex had also suffered lightning damage from the storm on September 9th. The copier, one computer, and internet router were no longer operational. She estimated the cost to repair or replace these items was \$3,000 to \$4,000 and she did not have the funds available in her budget. The Commission stated that the insurance deductible for the claim would be \$5000. After discussion, Commissioner Thompson moved to fund the repairs caused from the lighting in the Public Administrator's Office. Presiding Commissioner Pickens seconded the motion. The Commission stated they would contact the Adair County Collector to see if he would like to help fund this expense from the Collector's Tax Maintenance Fund.

The Commission was notified that the Ford Pickup ordered for the Adair County Road and Bridge Department had arrived at the dealership.

At 1:30 p.m., the Commission attended a presentation at the Adair County Annex from Midland GIS and Surdex Aerials. Adair County Assessor, Donnie Waybill, was investigating the possibility of having the County photographed from the air to update the geographical information system. Members from other interested entities were also invited.

The Commission spent the rest of the day attending to County business.

The Adair County Commission adjourned at 4:00 p.m. on September 15, 2014.
