Ms. Jackson said the shelter could only take the animals if there was room.

Citizen, Bridget Thomas, said that smaller cities did chip in. She felt there was a need to protect the animals in the rural area and believed it was the Commission's job. She continued by saying the City had a standard to deal with the animals, the County did not, and the County should feel crappy about that.

Ms. Jackson said there was an increase in the number of dumped dogs. There were 20-30 per month that are dumped in the County. She wanted to work together to get something done.

Chief Hughes said that both the City and the County were getting impacted by the problem.

Citizen, Claire Peckosh, said she took a dog in and paid the fee herself. Citizen, Carmon Stanton, said she had grant writing experience. Chief Hughes said that everyone liked people working together. It was agreed that all avenues needed to be explored and they should go after everything.





Commissioner Adams mentioned that the County constructed a pen at the Road and Bridge Department which consisted of a pen, house, water, and straw. However, the State came in and it was never used. It was only meant to have been a temporary location.


Chief Hughes thanked the Commission for listening and Commissioner Thompson thanked them for contacting the Commission. It was agreed that no one needed to look back, but needed to go forward. Everyone needed to communicate. It was also mentioned that the Missouri Department of Conservation should be invited to the task force meeting for input purposes.


The Commission spent the rest of the day attending to County business.
