SCRAP TIRE ROUNDUP PROGRAM


For Residents of Adair County Only

Purpose: This program provides Adair County residents a one-time opportunity to bring their old tires to the collection site free of charge. Additionally, the breeding habitat in the rain filled tires for mosquitoes which carry the West Nile Virus and Equine Encephalitis will be removed.

Time/location: April 9th from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Adair County Road and Bridge Facility at 23016 Potter Trail.

Restrictions: This program is available to *citizens of Adair County only* (including towns/cities within) and will be enforced. DNR has established the following restrictions: Businesses not eligible to participate in this event include tire stores, vehicle repair shops, tire haulers, farm implement dealers, trucking companies, contractors, etc. Foam-filled tires are not accepted.

Final Destination for the tires: Missouri Vocational Enterprise (MVE) of the Department of Corrections will provide semi-trailers to transport the tires to the MVE's tire processing facility near Jefferson City to be shredded into fuel for power plants.
