Commissioner Thompson informed everyone that Presiding Commissioner Pickens spoke on behalf of the County at the "State of the County" address hosted and commended him for the presentation. The event was hosted by the Kirksville Area Chamber of Commerce. He stated that in the near future there would be a collection sight for glass containers. A \$67,000 check was received from the State Emergency Management Agency (SEMA). This was for reimbursement from storm damage that occurred September 9 - 10, 2014. The total reimbursement from the disaster will be approximately \$205,000.

Commissioner Thompson stated that at the request of Judge Steele, the County was ready to return to Court in order to resolve issues stemming from the County's alleged non-compliance of the Settlement Agreement signed by both parties in December, 2014. The County is welcoming the opportunity to obtain clarification of several issues. Commissioner Thompson felt the Judicial System did not have any checks or balances to their operations as did other elected offices. Sheriff Hardwick confirmed Commissioner Thompson's statement that Judge Steele was forgiving tens of thousands of board bills which is money that could be used to fund law enforcement.

Mrs. Collop stated that the County is exploring new voting equipment. The current equipment is outdated and increased costs of repair and programming are now being reviewed. Two different vendors will be demonstrating their new equipment in May.

At 11:00 a.m., the Commission attended a presentation today by CI3 Integrators regarding installing security cameras in the Courthouse.

The Commission spent the rest of day attending to County business.

The Adair County Commission adjourned at 4:00 p.m. on April 28, 2015.
