

**ADAIR COUNTY COMMISSION MINUTES
TUESDAY, AUGUST 19, 2014
8TH DAY JULY ADJOURNED**

The Adair County Commission convened at 8:30 a.m. on August 19, 2014 in the Courthouse at Kirksville. All Commissioners were present.

Larry Mudd stopped by to report debris had lodged on a bridge on Gifford Trail over Sugar Creek. He had already notified the Road & Bridge Department, but wanted the Commissioners to know.

At 11:24 a.m., the Adair County Commission adopted the following resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED that this meeting be continued in emergency closed session, with closed records and closed votes as permitted by law, for consideration of the following items as authorized by section 610.021.1 of the Missouri statutes:

Discussion under Subsection 1 of the statute for "Legal actions, causes of action or litigation involving a public governmental body and any confidential or privileged communications between a public governmental body or its representatives and its attorneys. However, any minutes, vote or settlement agreement relating to legal actions, causes of actions or litigation involving a public governmental body or" ... and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if any business not covered by the stated reason or reasons for the closed session is raised during the closed session, that such business will be postponed until this meeting is reopened to the public and the sign for a closed meeting is removed from the doors of the Commission office. Present at the meeting were Presiding Commissioner Pickens; Commissioner Adams; Commissioner Thompson; Adair County Clerk, Sandra Collop; Adair County Treasurer, Lori Smith; and via telephone Adair County Legal Counsel, Ivan Schraeder of the Lowenbaum Partnership, L.L.C. So motioned by Commissioner Thompson and seconded by Commissioner Adams with Commissioner Pickens approving at 11:24 a.m. on Tuesday, August 19, 2014.

Closed session ended at 11:37 a.m.


Commissioner Adams moved to transfer \$4,500 from General Revenue – Transfers Out – Temporary Loan to Child Support Enforcement (101-5-025-700.000) to Child Support Enforcement – Temporary Loan from General Revenue (905-4-000-600.400). The motion was seconded by Commissioner Thompson with all in favor. This transfer will allow Child Support Enforcement (Multi County) to maintain their operation of services until reimbursement is received from the State of Missouri with eventual repayment to Adair County.

The Commission spent the rest of the day attending to County business.

The Adair County Commission adjourned at 4:00 p.m. on August 19, 2014.
