## ADAIR COUNTY COMMISSION MINUTES MONDAY, AUGUST 24, 2015 10TH DAY JULY ADJOURNED

The Adair County Commission convened at 8:30 a.m. on August 24, 2015 in the Courthouse at Kirksville. Presiding Commissioner Pickens and Commissioner Adams were present. Commissioner Thompson was absent.

The Commission and Adair County Clerk, Sandra Collop, traveled to the Knox County Courthouse in Edina, Missouri to attend the trial of Scott Ebling. Mr. Ebling had been arrested for stealing a 2006 Chevy Impala owned by the County of Adair. The date of loss occurred January 7, 2015, and the vehicle had been totaled per the insurance company. The Commission was asked by the Court to appear for the trial as "victims' in the case. The trial had been scheduled or 8: 30 a.m. When they arrived, it was discovered that the date had been postponed until Tuesday, August 25, 2015 at 1:30 p.m. The Circuit Clerk's office apologized for the misunderstanding. The Commission traveled back to Adair County.

Later in the morning, the Commission attended a Public Assistance Program/Sub-Recipient's Briefing held at the Missouri Department of Conservation in Kirksville. Several counties in Missouri had sustained severe storms, tornadoes, straight-line winds, and flooding from May 15 to July 27, 2015. Governor Jay Nixon requested on July 21, 2015 that these counties be considered for disaster relief from the State of Missouri Emergency Management Agency. The President of the United States granted this request on August 7, 2015 and the Federal Emergency Management Agency declared disaster number, FEMA-4238-DR. The application for Federal/State Public Assistance was completed and signed by Presiding Commissioner Pickens. Grant certification forms will need to be completed by October 9, 2015.

The Commission spent the rest of the day attending to County business.

The Adair County Commission adjourned at 4:00 p.m. on August 24, 2015.
