## ADAIR COUNTY COMMISSION MINUTES WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 12, 2020 6TH DAY JULY ADJOURNED

The Adair County Commission convened at 8:30 a.m. on August 12, 2020 in the Courthouse at Kirksville. Commissioner King and Commissioner Thompson were present. Presiding Commissioner Shahan was absent due to being quarantined from exposure to the Coronavirus.

The Commission spoke with the Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT) concerning State lettered highways associated with the wind farm project in Adair and Schuyler counties.

Those attending telephonically along with the Commission was Amy Crawford, Rob, Jennifer, with MoDOT; Mary Macomber, Kirksville City Manager; and Bree Lawson, Schuyler County Clerk.

Currently the traffic is very heavy due to construction and damage is being repaired temporarily by adding rock and initiating lower speed limits. Plans for reconstruction will have to wait until the conditions of the roads are evaluated once windfarm construction is complete. The goal after completion will be to get the road back into the condition it was before Terra-Gen started construction.

Amy Crawford said that based on the current schedule, they will not be finished in November or December but possibly in January.

Mary Macomber stated that it needs to be communicated to the public that roads will be repaired to the condition they were at the start of the project.

Commissioner Mark Thompson said it would be good to refer the public to MoDOT for questions at 1 888-askmodot.

Bree Lawson, Schuyler Co Clerk, asked about money that was received by MoDOT for repairs and was told that MoDOT is currently drawing funds to make repairs and will use the rest of the funds to repair the roads.

Amy said they are working on getting the information out and trying to find the right way to reach more people.

The Adair County Commission adjourned at 4:00 p.m. on August 12, 2020.
