

**ADAIR COUNTY COMMISSION MINUTES**  
**WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 5, 2020**  
**3RD DAY JULY ADJOURNED**

The Adair County Commission convened at 8:30 a.m. on August 5, 2020 in the Courthouse at Kirksville. All Commissioners were present.

Adair County Clerk, Sandra Collop, reported unofficial Adair County election results from the August 4, 2020 Primary. There was a voter turnout of 35.13 percent.

Note: Constitutional Amendment No. 2 for Missouri - Referendum ordered by Petition - appeared on all ballot types. Results are listed at the end of the election results.

Results of the Republican ballot were as follows:


Governor for Missouri: Mike Parson with 2,643 votes defeated Saundra McDowell with 548 votes, James W. (Jim) Neely with 477 votes, and Raleigh Ritter with 124 votes. Lieutenant Governor: Mike Kehoe with 1,890 with votes defeated Mike Carter with 857 votes, Aaron T Wisdom with 312 votes, and Arnie C. AC Dienoff with 176 votes. Secretary of State: John R. (Jay) Ashcroft with 3400 votes and no opposition. State Treasurer: Scott Fitzpatrick with 3,205 votes and no opposition. Attorney General: Eric Schmitt with 3,228 votes and no opposition. U.S. Representative 6<sup>th</sup> District: Sam Graves with 2,894 votes defeated Chris Ryan with 819 votes. State Representative for 3<sup>rd</sup> District: Danny Busick with 2,368 votes with no opposition. State Representative for 4<sup>th</sup> District: Greg Sharpe with 859 votes and no opposition. Commissioner of the County Commission – 1<sup>st</sup> District: William “Bill” King with 1,061 votes defeated Phillip John Biston with 582 votes. Commissioner of the County Commission – 2<sup>nd</sup> District: Mark Thompson with 1,235 votes defeated Molly Balliew with 864 votes. Sheriff: Eldon Grissom with 1,822 votes defeated Tracy Salsberry with 1,155 votes and Matt Kellison with 974 votes. Assessor: Kent Bryant with 3,274 votes and no opposition. Public Administrator: Rhonda Noe with 3,401 votes and no opposition. Coroner: Brian C Noe with 3,144 votes defeated Charles “Chuck” Watson with 739 votes.

Results of the Democratic ballot were as follows:

Governor: Nicole Galloway with 889 votes defeated Eric Morrison with 42 votes, Jimmie Matthews with 33 votes, Antoin Johnson with 26 votes, and Robin John Daniel Van Quaethem with 8 votes. Lieutenant Governor: Alissia Canady with 728 votes defeated Gregory A Upchurch with 185 votes. Secretary of State: Yinka Faleti with 872 votes and no opposition. State Treasurer: Vicki Lorenz Englund with 879 votes and no opposition. Attorney General: Rich Finnerman with 458 votes defeated Elad Gross with 425 votes. U.S. Representative 6<sup>th</sup> District: Ramona Farris with 276 votes defeated Gena L. Ross with 266 votes, Henry Martin with 208 votes, Charles West with 144 votes, and Donald Robert Sartain with 8 votes. Commissioner of the County Commission – 2<sup>nd</sup> District: Karen Carolan with 294 votes and no opposition.

Secretary of State: Paul Venable with 0 votes and no opposition.


Constitutional Amendment No. 2 *Proposed by Initiative Petition*: Do you want to amend the Missouri Constitution to:

- adopt Medicaid Expansion for persons 19 to 64 years old with an income level at or below 133% of the federal poverty level, as set forth in the Affordable Care Act;
- prohibit placing greater or additional burdens on eligibility or enrollment standards, methodologies or practices on persons covered under Medicaid; and
- require state agencies to take all actions necessary to maximize federal financial participation in funding medical assistance under Medicaid Expansion? State government entities are estimated to have one-time costs of approximately \$6.4 million and an unknown annual net fiscal impact by 2026 ranging from increased costs of at least \$200 million to savings for \$1 billion. Local governments expect costs to decrease by an unknown amount. YES - 1,941 votes; NO - 3,037 votes


The August 4, 2020 Primary Election is scheduled to be certified on August 7, 2020 and results could vary.




Glenn Smith, Terra Gen Representative, said that he wanted to reach out to the Commission to discuss concerns about MoDOT and the lettered highways around the windfarm. Mr. Smith told the Commission that there is a road use agreement between MoDOT and Terra Gen and the agreement states that MoDOT will repair roads during and replace roads back to their pre-construction condition.

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
Commissioner Shahan said that he understands the County has no jurisdiction concerning State highways but wanted to be able to address concerns brought to the Commission by citizens. Commissioner Shahan stated that he does not feel that the roads will be fixed by MoDOT. Commissioner Shahan said that if the roads are not fixed it is going to make Ameren look bad and he wanted to know more about the road plan. Glenn Smith said that Lucas Klein from Ameren could speak more towards the plans regarding MoDOT. Mr. Klein stated that MoDOT is supposed to repair the roads during and after construction and Ameren is counting on MoDOT to following through with the road agreement. Mr. Klein stated that all complaints regarding the State highways should go through MoDOT. Commissioner Shahan said that the Commission has read the road agreement. Commissioner Shahan said that MoDOT told them they would need a sunshine request to obtain a copy but that he had gotten one through Senator Cindy O'Laughlin. Glenn Smith said that 2.8 million dollars was given to MoDOT for both Schuyler and Adair Counties to repair the State highways during and following construction of the windfarm. Mr. Smith stated the money was obligated to be spent all on the roads affected by the windfarm project. The windfarm project company cannot repair the blacktop roads because that's MoDOT responsibility, but they can make inquiries and ask questions of MoDOT regarding the condition of the roads. Commissioner Shahan said that he knows 2.8 million is not going to touch the cost of road repairs for both counties and he wants to be able to talk smart to the residents that call the Commission with complaints. Glenn Smith said that Terra Gen felt that number was sufficient to give MoDOT for maintenance and repairs. Mr. Smith said that any complaints should be directed to MoDOT. Mr. Smith will also talk with Steve Sanders (Terra Gen Rep) about what he is seeing, and Mr. Smith asked the Commission if they felt MoDOT was slacking on their responsibilities to maintain the roads. Commissioner Shahan said that he felt MoDOT was doing what they can and knows that MoDOT is shorthanded and working reduced hours. Commissioner Shahan said that he also knows the concrete work is completed so that will help.


Derek Weber (RPC) asked about a timeframe on when Terra Gen felt the heavy equipment would no longer be needed and when MoDOT would start repairs. Glenn Smith stated that it should occur the end of August or Mid-September. Commissioner Shahan asked when the project would be finished. Glenn Smith said that it is a fluid situation and that they are going to work like crazy to get the project turned over to Ameren by October.

Commissioner Shahan asked how the power generation would be assessed. Lucas Klein said Ameren believes that it will be assessed by Chapter 7.7 of the Missouri State Tax Commission Code. Mr. Klein said it is an outdated code, but it is all they can go by right now and it is a tiered valuation approach. Mr. Klein said he would send Commissioner Shahan a link to Chapter 7.7. Glenn Smith stated that he has not heard anything about an updated wind generation assessment process. Commissioner Shahan said that proposed legislation went through the house already but does not know if it will pass legislation. Commissioner Thompson said that the Committee for Assessment proposed a 60% abatement on windfarms which is a large abatement and causes concerns for local school districts that were counting on the revenue. Glenn Smith said that Terra Gen has no horse in the race and really the abatement issues will affect Ameren.

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Glenn Smith said he still has not forgotten about the use tax question and he will provide the Commission with a use tax estimate for 2020.

Commissioner Thompson stated that the Commission does not have control over the state roads, and it is a MoDOT issue.

Glenn Smith said that the payment to MoDOT was estimated at \$65,000 per mile for maintenance and repairs on 34 miles of road. Derek Weber (RPC) said that a straight overlay will not work with the kind of damage that has been done. Mr. Smith stated that the price paid to MoDOT included any prep work needed. Lucas Klein said he knows there are rumors that MoDOT was going to convert the lettered State highways to gravel. Chris Brinkmann (Ameren) said she would like to dispel the rumors that MoDOT was going to convert the lettered State highways to gravel. Ms. Brickman spoke with Amy Crawford from MoDOT and that those rumors could not be substantiated at all and it would literally take an act of congress to get the road conversions completed and given to the County. Ms. Brickman said that MoDOT could not tell her exactly what measures they would complete to repair the roads, but the roads will not be converted to gravel. Commissioner Shahan said that the County would have to agree to accept those roads anyway and the County would not do that.

Glenn Smith said that if the Commission feels like MoDOT is not addressing safety concerns that Terra Gen would be happy to assist in addressing these issues with MoDOT.



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### IN REF. ORDER NO 6 Adair County Fraud Risk Policy and Code of Conduct Policy

**Adair County**  
**Fraud Risk Policy and Code of Conduct Policy**

Periodically, the Adair County Commission will perform a Risk Assessment review to ensure that internal controls policy and procedures are being followed to prevent fraud and minimize risk. As part of the review an appropriate risk assessment will be completed by the Elected Officials and reviewed by the Adair County Commissioners. If necessary, policy and procedures will be updated to address any problem areas.

**County Fraud, Waste, and Abuse Policy**

**STATEMENT FROM COUNTY COMMISSION**

The County has zero tolerance for the commission or concealment of acts of fraud, waste, or abuse. Allegations of such acts will be investigated and pursued to their logical conclusion, including legal action where warranted. All employees are responsible for reporting suspected instances of fraud, waste, and abuse in accordance with this Policy.

The County Commission is responsible for the effectiveness and efficiency of County Government operations, including the protection of County assets from fraud, waste, and abuse. The Commission has the primary responsibility for the implementation of internal controls to deter and detect fraud.

The County Commission is responsible for assisting in the deterrence and detection of fraud, waste, and abuse in Government by examining and evaluating the adequacy and the effectiveness of the County's systems of internal control, commensurate with the extent of the potential risk in the various segments of the County's organization. The County Commission has primary responsibility for the investigation of fraudulent acts committed by or against the County Government.

**SCOPE**

This policy applies to all Elected Officials and County employees. The provisions of this policy apply to any instance of fraud, waste, or abuse involving not only Elected Officials and employees, as well as consultants, vendors, contractors, outside agencies doing business with employees of the county, and/or any other parties with a business relationship with Adair County Government.

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Fraud is an intentional act that results in the misappropriation of assets or the misstatement of financial reporting. Management is responsible for the prevention and detection of fraud, misappropriations, and other inappropriate conduct. Elected Officials and Department Supervisors shall be familiar with the types of improprieties that might occur within their area of responsibility, and be alert for any indication of irregularity.

**ACTIONS CONSTITUTING FRAUD**

Some examples are (but not limited to):

- Misuse or embezzlement of funds;
- Forgery or alteration of a check, bank draft, or any other financial document;
- Alteration or falsification of any document or account;
- Misappropriation of funds, supplies, or other assets;
- Impropriety in the handling or reporting of money or financial transactions;
- Accepting or agreeing to accept or seeking anything of material value from contractors, vendors or persons providing services/materials to the County in exchange for any official action or inaction on a matter which the County official or employee is empowered to act. Destruction, removal, or inappropriate use of records, furniture, fixtures, and equipment and/or any potentially criminal conduct.

**TO REPORT FRAUDULENT ACTIVITY**

Fraud that is detected or suspected shall be reported immediately to the Adair County Commission, the Sheriff and/or the Adair County Prosecutor. Any investigation into reported activities will respect the confidentiality of the complainant to the extent possible.

**DEFINITIONS OF FRAUD, WASTE, AND ABUSE**

**Fraud**

The American Institute of Certified Public Accountants (AICPA) defines two basic categories of fraud: intentional misstatement of financial information and misappropriation

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of assets (or theft). Other audit-related organizations provide additional insight into the definition of fraud that can be summarized as follows:

Fraud consists of an illegal act (the intentional wrongdoing), the concealment of this act, and the deriving of a benefit (converting the gain to cash or other valuable commodity).

Legally, fraud can lead to a variety of criminal charges including theft, embezzlement, and larceny - each with its own specific legal definition and required criteria - each of which can result in severe penalties and a criminal record.

**Waste**

"Waste" means the thoughtless or careless expenditure, consumption, mismanagement, use, or squandering of resources owned or operated by the County to the detriment or potential detriment of the County. Waste also includes incurring unnecessary costs because of inefficient or ineffective practices, systems, or controls. Waste does not normally lead to an allegation of "fraud", but it could.

**Abuse**

"Abuse" means the excessive, or improper use of something, or the use of something in a manner contrary to the natural or legal rules for its use; the intentional destruction, diversion, manipulation, misapplication, maltreatment, or misuse of resources owned or operated by the County; or extravagant or excessive use as to abuse one's position or authority.

"Abuse" does not necessarily lead to an allegation of "fraud", but it could.

Examples of fraud, waste, and abuse activities include, but are not limited to:

- Forgery or alteration of documents (checks, contracts, purchase orders, invoices, time sheets, leave records, etc.);
- Misrepresentation of information on documents (employment history, time sheets, leave records, travel reimbursement requests, financial records, etc.);
- Theft, unauthorized removal, or willful destruction of County records, County property, or the property of other persons (to include the property of employees, customers, or visitors);
- Misappropriation of funds, equipment, supplies, or any other asset;
- Improprieties in the handling and reporting of financial transactions.

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- Serious abuse of County time such as unauthorized time away from work, falsification of work hours reported, or excessive use of County time for personal business.
- Authorizing or receiving payments for goods not received or services not performed.
- Vendor kickbacks.
- Authorizing or receiving payment for hours not worked.
- Misuse of authority for personal gain.
- Any computer-related activity involving the alteration, destruction, forgery, or manipulation of data for fraudulent purposes.
- Inappropriate use of County-provided electronic devices such as computers, PDAs, cell phones, pagers, or e-mail.

**RESPONSIBILITIES**

**Employees**

Any County employee who has knowledge of fraud, waste, or abuse, or who has good reason to suspect that such conduct has occurred, shall adhere to the procedures in this Policy.

When suspected fraudulent activity, waste, or abuse is observed by, or made known to, an employee, the employee shall immediately report the activity to his/her direct supervisor. If the employee believes that the supervisor is involved with the activity, he/she shall immediately report the activity to the Elected Official. If the employee believes that the supervisor or the Elected Official may be involved with the activity, the employee shall contact the County Commission directly. If the County Commission is believed to be a party to the matter, it should then be reported directly to the Prosecuting Attorney.

The employee shall not make any attempt to investigate the suspected activity prior to reporting it. The County shall coordinate investigations of fraud, waste, or abuse.


An employee shall not destroy, or allow to be destroyed, any document or record of any kind that the employee knows may be relevant to a past, present or future investigation of fraud, waste, or abuse.



# ADAIR COUNTY COMMISSION MINUTES

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The County Commission cannot compel citizens and customers (non-employees) to report suspected instances of fraud, waste, or abuse. However, the County Commission strongly encourages them to do so.

**County Commission Responsibilities**

The County Commission will coordinate the Fraud, Waste, and Abuse Referral System. The County Commission will receive all reports and initiate and coordinate all investigations.

To the extent allowed by law, the County Commission (and any assistants working for the Commission, if applicable) will review relevant information in a confidential and professional manner, and will conduct a prompt preliminary investigation of the alleged activity. The preliminary investigation may include employee interviews and analysis of available records. A full investigation will follow if evidence indicates possible fraud, waste, and/or abuse.

The County Commission shall be given unlimited and unrestricted access to all books, records, property (including desks and computers), and personnel during such investigations. Once an investigation is undertaken, the County Commission will take immediate action to prevent the theft, alteration, or destruction of relevant records. Such actions may include, but are not limited to, limiting access to the location where the records currently exist, preventing the individual(s) who is the subject of the investigation from having access to the records, and/or taking actual possession of such records.

Once the County Commission has sufficient, competent evidence that there is indeed an unauthorized, illegal, irregular or unsound practice that could (or already has) affect the County Government, the County Commission is required under State Statute to report the matter to the Prosecuting Attorney. If a member of the Commission is believed to be a party to the matter, the County Clerk will report the matter directly to the Prosecutor. The County Clerk and/or Commission and Prosecuting Attorney will then advise other Elected Officials/agencies as necessary (e.g., Sheriff, State Attorney General's Office).



Please keep the following in mind when reporting:


- If possible, report the issue to your supervisor or Elected Official first.
- You must be able to provide adequate information to support an investigation. Mere speculation does not suffice.



\* Your report must be made in good faith. An employee who knowingly makes a false or bad faith complaint will be subject to disciplinary and/or legal action.
