ADAIR COUNTY COMMISSION MINUTES TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 5, 2019 2ND DAY OCTOBER ADJOURNED

The Adair County Commission convened at 8:30 a.m. on November 5, 2019 in the Courthouse at Kirksville. All Commissioners were present.

At 10:00 a.m., the Commission conducted a bid opening for road resurfacing of approximately 20,400 square yards of roadway from Potter Street to Route 6 in Adair County. No one from the public attended the bid opening. Commissioner Shahan opened the bids and read them aloud. He stated that no bid award would be made as he was merely getting an idea of the cost of the work to put on the County's capital improvement list.

Bids were received from W. L. Miller Company in the amount of \$58,344.00 for chip and seal; \$153,800.60 for 1 inch asphalt overlay and \$215,700.91 for 1½ inch asphalt overlay; plus \$15,477.00 for trackless tack coat.

Bids from Willis Bros., Inc. was for chip and seal only om the amount of \$55,080.00 for oil and pea gravel; \$58,140.00 for oil and hay dite; \$5,500.00 to fill areas with cold mix; and \$4,800.00 for traffic control if required.

The Commission will notify the bidders of their decision to not award a bid.

At 1:30 p.m., the Commission met with Rob Needham of White Oak Trail to discuss Order No. 6 established July 7, 1998. Today was the result of Mr. Needham's meeting with the Commission on October 29, 2019.

Mr. Needham's concern regarded the second paragraph in Order No. 6. Commissioner King read the paragraph aloud:

"If permission is granted to alter the road, property owners then become responsible for the pot holes or other repairs cause by the materials applied."

Mr. Needham wants the Commission to pay property owners on White Oak Trail reimbursement for gravel at the same rate property owners on gravel roads receive each year. Commissioner King stated that some years earlier, the Commission had given money to other property owners for road improvements.

Commissioner King then moved to add to the second paragraph of Order No. 6 established July 7, 1998: "Any further assistance from the County is at the discretion of the County Commission." Mr. Needham then said he was pushing for the requirement for reimbursement. People have approached the Commission and given assistance when asked, what changes it now?

Commissioner King said what was done in the past shouldn't have been done but was. Mr. Needham said he was asking for assistance today as he asked for one year ago. He wanted to know if it would help his case if he came in the spring, but still at the Commission's discretion.

Commissioner King said they would still have the discretion. Mr. Needham said the sentence would still be in the paragraph. He wanted it to say that people would get the money spent on the rock. Commissioner Shahan said it would be a possibility then.

Commissioner King said they needed to look at the future. He wanted to give the Commission the leeway to do or not to do. The Commission should have put "discretion" in the paragraph in the beginning.

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Commissioner Shahan said the language was too definite and pinned them in. Commissioner Thompson said the language addressed dust control and lots of things that could be done. He thinks they should give Adair County's legal counsel a chance to review.

Commissioner Shahan then seconded the motion.

Mrs. Collop called for a roll call vote:

First District Commissioner King - YAY

Second District Commissioner Thompson – NAY

Presiding Commissioner Shahan - YAY

Mrs. Collop: Motion passes. Is there another motion to go before the County Commission? Presiding Commissioner said "No."

Mr. Needham thought this was a step in the right direction. That was all he was asking. That was all he had. He would be back to ask for further assistance with more people in the spring.

The meeting concluded at 1:45 p.m.

The Adair County Commission adjourned at 4:00 p.m. on November 5, 2019.

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
