

ADAIR COUNTY COMMISSION MINUTES
MONDAY, NOVEMBER 25, 2019
7TH DAY OCTOBER ADJOURNED

The Adair County Commission convened at 8:30 a.m. on November 25, 2019 in the Courthouse at Kirksville. All Commissioners were present.

At 10:00 a.m., the Commission met with David Krueger and Zachery Krueger of RTS Waste Management Services. Mr. Kruger stated that his company had plans to build a waste transfer station at the old State highway shed on Highway 11 West. They had already met with the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) who asked that they speak with the County Commission first. He stated that the facility will be open to the public.

Mr. Kruger said they would have a bay dedicated to re-cycling which they will hand separate. Recycled materials will be stock piled until there is a market for it. It will take six months to one year to obtain the permit for the transfer station. The waste will go to Slater, Missouri.

Every Monday will be trash pickup for the City. The City is responsible for glass pickup. All trash picked up north of Hwy 15 will be sent to LaGrange, Missouri. They are currently serving four or five counties in this area.

The transfer station will have a full time manager during open hours. It will be fenced in and gates locked. There will be a security system with cameras. Yard waste may also be picked up in the future. All trucks will be headquartered in Adair County. There will be six employees with at least two living in the County. The in-town trucks have 25 yard beds as opposed to 40. They provide 64 gallon cans. Mr. Kruger hopes to begin construction of the transfer station in July, 2020.

The Adair County Commission spent the rest of the day attending to County business.

The Adair County Commission adjourned at 4:00 p.m. on November 25, 2019.
