

ADAIR COUNTY COMMISSION MINUTES
MONDAY, AUGUST 6, 2018
2ND DAY JULY ADJOURNED

The Adair County Commission convened at 8:30 a.m. on August 6, 2018 in the Courthouse at Kirksville. All Commissioners were present.

At 11:00 a.m., the Commission met with Brad Ray of Sprocket Technologies and Rhonda Noe, Adair County Public Administrator. Mrs. Noe wanted to discuss computer and phone issues in her office. Voices were cutting in and out.

Mr. Ray said he had evaluated the situation and the problem stemmed from the internet connection at the Courthouse. He said there was a "latency" issue which is a delay between the start and end of a transmission. The Public Administrator is linked to the internet connection at the Courthouse even though located in another building. He said the internet speed was not good at the Courthouse, but usable. That could be the reasoning for the delays.

Mr. Ray suggested the County change to Cable One for an internet provider. He was told that the County had recently signed a three year contract with AT & T. He asked to review the contract. Mr. Ray said it did not address latency or guaranteed speed. He asked that the County contact him if they changed providers again in the future.

Mr. Ray presented two proposals to potentially solve the issue at the Public Administrator's office and one proposal for a network security/firewall appliance. He said the firewall definitely needed to be replaced. He said that January 14, 2020 was end of life for Windows 10 and suggested that each office budget for computer hardware and software replacement in 2019. New licenses would also need to be purchased.

The Commission will review his proposals and notify Mr. Ray of their decision.


At 1:30 p.m., the Commission met with Jim Reeves, of Lost Branch Way. Also present was Adair County Road and Bridge Supervisor, Isaiah Curtis. Mr. Reeves wanted to discuss whether or not a portion of the road could possibly be closed. Lost Branch Way ends at a low water crossing and then the road is named Chrysler Way. Road rock ends some distance from the low water crossing on both roads.

Mr. Reeves, Commissioner Thompson, Commissioner King, and Mr. Curtis studied the map on the Assessor's website. Commissioner Thompson wanted to speak with the Assessor and the Mapper about the situation, but they were not readily available. Commissioner Thompson said he would discuss the matter with both when they returned. Mr. Reeves was agreeable and wanted to be contacted with the information. He ultimately would like to close the portion of the road that is past his home if it is a County road.

The Commission reflected a change to the minutes of Monday, December 1, 2014 (12th DAY OCTOBER ADJOURNED). In the second paragraph, the words "Laurel Lane" should read "Bullhead Trail." Page 521 (a) will be added to County Commission Record E-35 for the correction.




