The Adair County Commission convened at 8:30 a.m. on September 5, 2017 in the Courthouse at Kirksville. The Adair County Courthouse was closed on Monday, September 4, 2017 in observance of Labor Day. First District Commissioner, Bill King, and Second District Commissioner, Mark Thompson, were present. Commissioner Thompson will continue to be acting Presiding Commissioner during the absence of Presiding Commissioner Pickens. Presiding Commissioner, Stanley Pickens, arrived in the afternoon.

Steve Richardson voiced concerns about the Mark Twain Transmission route.

Janie Fouch with her father, Frank Pickens, arrived and submitted a petition to the County Commission. The petition addressed To Whom It May Concern and was signed by several individuals. It stated "they were appalled by ATXI's current and past abuse of our community – We are opposed to establishing a precedent where large companies use lawsuits to bully local government."

At 2:25 p.m., the Adair County Commission adopted the following resolution:

The hearing was the result of a request by Ameren Transmission Company of Illinois for an assent from the Adair County Commission pursuant to 229.100 RSMo for the proposed route of the Mark Twain 345-KV electric transmission line project.

Members of the public asked questions and raised concerns during the public hearing with respect to the proposed route. Also attending were members of Ameren Transmission Company and their legal counsel. Capital City Court Reporting documented all proceedings of the hearing. Copies of the transcript will be available to the public when completed.

At the end of the evening, Commissioner Thompson asked the question – Is there a motion tonight on the request for assent? Presiding Commission Pickens stated: I move that the Adair County Commission vote to grant assent to the Ameren Transmission 245 – or 345 to Ameren for the purpose of construction of the line within the route as described and attached hereto as Exhibit A1 and Exhibit A2. This assent is granted reserving the right for the Adair County Commission for the future application requesting the Adair County Commission grant assent pursuant to Missouri Revised Statute 229.0 by ATXI or any entity. Mr. Loraine then replied: It's actually 229.100. Presiding Commissioner Pickens continued: .10, yes. He then turned to Mr. Dauphinais and said: I'll let you -- Per Mr. Dauphinais: this is the motion Commissioner Pickens is putting forth: I move that the Adair County Commission vote to grant assent to Ameren Transmission Company of Illinois for purposes of constructing a 345 KV electric transmission line within the route as described and attached hereto as Exhibit A1 and Exhibit A2. This assent is granted reserving all rights of the Adair County Commission with respect to future applications requesting the Adair County Commission's assent pursuant to Missouri Revised Statute 229.100 by ATXI or any other entity. This assent is condition on Ameren Missouri and Ameren Transmission Company of Illinois not raising voltage of the 161 KV circuit on the Teal Line option without first seeking as assent from the Adair County Commission.

And Exhibit A1 is the Notice of Public Hearing for this public hearing. Exhibit A2 is the very detailed route maps that were provided by Ameren Transmission Company of Illinois in response to the Adair County Commission's request for information on July 18, 2017.

Commissioner King seconded the motion.

Commissioner Thompson then moved to table the motion presented earlier until we receive written commitment of what's proposed tonight.

Attorney Loraine said we didn't need to do that as Ameren is on the record with this and if they violate that, they'll be in a courtroom.

Commissioner Thompson responded, due to the lack of second to the motion to table, the motion died.

Adair County Clerk, Sandra Collop, then conducted a roll call vote. First District Commissioner, William King, stated he was in favor of the motion. Second District Commissioner, Mark Thompson, stated he was not in favor of the motion. Presiding Commissioner, Stanley Pickens, stated he was in favor of the motion.

Mrs. Collop stated "Motion passes."

Commissioner Thompson thanked the audience for their attendance and adjourned the meeting at approximately 10:00 p.m.
