Commissioner Thompson asked why they would run the Drug Court Administrator through Knox County when they don't have a drug court. Mr. Williams said that they did have Knox County participants that ran through the other Drug Courts.

Commissioner Adams voiced his concern that there were only six county employees identified by the settlement agreement, and the distinction of state versus county benefits, and the potential employee lawsuit that could arise.

Patrick Williams said that Jane Moore was affiliated with the Circuit before but has changed. He will make sure everything lines up with the agreement and thanked everyone for attending. Mr. Williams and Judge Steele left.

Knox County Presiding Commissioner Glasgow said that they had already discussed it with Mr. Schraeder and was told it would be a conflict with the agreement and they were not going to do anything with the Drug Court Administrator until they were sure it would not create a conflict.

Commissioner Adams explained how the circuit had to prepay Adair County for the five employees and how a lawsuit could be created if they refused to pay even if they did not receive reimbursement. Also the different benefits offered for the county employees.

The meeting adjourned at 11:00 a.m.

The Commission then returned to Adair County.

The Adair County Commission adjourned at 4:00 p.m. on December 28, 2016.
