Amy Crawford, Missouri Department of Transportation Area Engineer – North Region (MoDOT), dropped by to give the Commission an update on plans they will begin implementing in 2013. First, a press release was issued on December 31, 2012 to restore the speed limit to 70 miles per hour (mph) between the Boone and Randolph County line to Kirksville. The change is expected to provide a more consistent driving experience, thus reducing confusion since U.S. 63 is 70 mph from Columbia south. Signs will begin changing the second and third weeks in January. They also plan to increase awareness at trouble intersections with added flashers, rumble strips, and signage to help with failure to yield issues. The new goal for Missouri is set to reduce traffic fatalities to 700 by 2016 using Missouri's Blueprint to SAVE MORE LIVES; and to implement the "On the Move" campaign in the spring of 2013 by conducting listening sessions around the State so the public can tell MoDOT what they want.

County Clerk, Sandra Collop, presented her 2013 budget to the Commission. Election costs will be considerably lower due to only one election being scheduled for April, 2013. High costs were experienced in 2012 due to the Presidential election. Mrs. Collop requested to purchase additional software to enhance the current payroll system of the County and to add Human Resource capabilities. The cost of the software would be shared with the Human Resource department.

The Adair County Commission adjourned at 4:00 p.m. on January 2, 2013.
