

**ADAIR COUNTY COMMISSION MINUTES**  
**WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 6, 2016**  
**3RD DAY JANUARY REGULAR**

The Adair County Commission convened at 8:30 a.m. on January 6, 2016 in the Courthouse at Kirksville. All Commissioners were present. However, Presiding Commissioner Pickens was absent for the meeting with the Greentop Fire District.

At 1:00 p.m., the Commission met with Kevin Phelps, Fire Chief of the Greentop Fire District, and Jeremy Crawford, Board President of the Greentop Fire District. Mr. Crawford began with stating that Mr. Phelps was a blessing for the Greentop Fire District as he had done a great job with handling the affairs of the district.

Mr. Crawford said there was a meeting with Adair County Rural Fire District #1. They agreed to meet up and look at the maps that Kevin will draw up for all fire districts. He said he liked the idea of the boundaries being in the plat book but did not like the boundaries. Documentation was then presented for the Commission to sign dissolving the boundary lines.

Commissioner Adams stated that per the Assessor no lines would be in the plat book. He wanted all districts to come and setup a map together with lines then the Commission would approve the new boundaries. Mr. Crawford and Mr. Phelps were trying to get the line back to where it was. They plan to meet with all the fire districts

Commissioner Thompson stated the Commission was not going backwards and wanted to go forward. After everyone had agreed to the new lines, then they would approve them. Mr. Phelps said there were not any boundaries in the beginning and would provide the statute number that boundaries need to be dissolved before they are established. Mr. Crawford then clarified with the Commission that the Fire Chiefs and Board Presidents needed to agree on the boundaries first. He said as long as the Board President agrees and the Fire Chief agrees he didn't care what the other members think.

Mr. Phelps said they could always go with Option B which is going through the Court system. - Commissioner Adams stated he felt threatened the other day when Mr. Phelps was here and feels that way now. So the Commission could go with Option B if Mr. Phelps wanted to. Mr. Phelps stated that the Commission needed to see his side, too, and they could also go with Plan B if they wanted to.


