ADAIR COUNTY COMMISSION MINUTES MONDAY, JUNE 16, 2014 19TH DAY APRIL ADJOURNED

The Adair County Commission convened at 8:30 a.m. on June 16, 2014 in the Courthouse at Kirksville. All Commissioners were present.

On June 12, the Commission received the fully executed supplemental agreement and Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission Administrative Order to install interim R1-1 stop signs and stop ahead signs along the roadway approaches to both sides of the Banner Lane Grade Crossing. The signs will be provided by the railroad and must be installed by BNSF Railway no later than June 15, 2015.

Amy Crawford with the Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT) met with the Commission to discuss their plans if Constitutional Amendment 7 is passed in the August 5, 2014 election. Mrs. Crawford presented a complete project list to the Commission that showed all the planned projects for the Northeast District. The projects for Adair County are as follows:

- 1. Resurface Business 63 from Rte. 6 West to Rte. 63 at Kirksville
- 2. Resurface Rte. 11 from Knox County to Rte. 63
- 3. Replace/repair the Rte. 149 bridge over Shuteye Creek
- 4. Construct and upgrade hangars and improve terminal at Kirksville Regional Airport
- 5. Replace/repair the Rte. 11 bridge over Little Mussel Fork Creek

The Commission also discussed with Mrs. Crawford temporary access on 63 during bridge replacement on Laurel Lane. Mrs. Crawford stated that MoDOT did not like to put in temporary access; but if the Commission could provide a timeline, it was possible that they would. The Commission said they would discuss this with the Isaiah Curtis, Road and Bridge Supervisor, and have him provide an estimated start date and timeline for completion.

Mrs. Crawford asked if the Commission had any additional questions and the meeting ended.

The Commission spent the rest of the day attending to County business.

The Adair County Commission adjourned at 4:00 p.m. on June 16, 2014.
