At 3:05 p.m., the Commission met with Adair County Road and Bridge Supervisor, Isaiah Curtis, and Norman Belitz regarding the road maintenance of Frist Trail. It was agreed that areas were needed for drainage of the road and Mr. Curtis agreed to work specific areas of the road. Mr. Curtis wanted him to know that all property owners on First Trail needed to be on the same page realizing that the road work could cut into someone's lawn. Yards may be impacted and it would be the landowners' responsibility for items such as grass seed to repair the impacted area. It was estimated that 100 ton per mile of rock would be needed at a minimum to get the road in good condition. Mr. Belitz stated he would speak to the property owners that would be affected before any work would be started. Mr. Curtis stated the project would take 8 – 10 days to complete and the road would be closed to thru traffic. Mr. Beliz also asked about the cost of a road tube. He may need to re-locate his existing tube and if it couldn't be re-laid, he would need to purchase a new one.

The Commission discussed the public hearing held earlier in the day regarding the Ameren Mark Twain Transmission project. Commissioner Thompson moved to continue to oppose the Ameren Mark Twain Transmission Project. Commissioner Adams seconded the motion with all in favor. The Commission will submit a letter of opposition to the Missouri Public Service Commission on behalf of the citizens of Adair County. Resolution # 17 – 2014 dated October 14, 2014 opposing the project, will also be included.

The Commission spent the rest of the day attending to County business.

The Adair County Commission adjourned at 4:00 p.m. on June 16, 2015.
