"Stepping Up Initiative" Adair County Resolution # 2016 - 1

"Stepping Up Initiative to Reduce the Number of People with Mental Illnesses in Jails" - May 2016.

WHEREAS, counties routinely provide treatment services to the estimated 2 million people with serious mental illnesses booked into jail each year; and

WHEREAS, prevalence rates of serious mental illnesses in jails are three to six times higher than for the general population; and

WHEREAS, almost three-quarters of adults with serious mental illnesses in jails have co-occurring substance use disorders, and

WHEREAS, adults with mental illnesses tend to stay longer in juil and upon release are at higher risk of recidivism than people without these disorders; and

WHEREAS, county jails spend two to three times more on adults with mental illnesses that require interventions compared to those without these treatment needs; and

WHEREAS, without the appropriate treatment and services, people with mental illnesses continue to cycle through the criminal justice system, often resulting in tragic outcomes for these individuals and their families; and

WHEREAS, through Supping Up, the National Association of Counties, the Council of State Governments Justice Center and the American Psychiatric Association Foundation are encouraging public, private and nonprofit partners to reduce the number of people with mental illnesses in juds;

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, THAT WE, the Adair County Commissioners, do bereby sign on the Call to Action to reduce the number of people with mental illnesses in our county jul, commit to sharing lessoms learned with other counties in my state and across the country to support a national infinites and encourage all county officials, employees and residents to participate in Steppine

Collect and review prevalence numbers and assess individuals' needs to better identify adolts entering jalls with mental illnesses and their residivism risk, and use that baseline information to guide decision making at the system, program and case levels.

Examine treatment and service capacity to determine which programs and services are available in the commy for people with mental illnesses and co-occurring substance use disorders, and dentify state and local policy and flunding barriers to minimizing contact with the islatic system and providing treatment and supports in the community.

Develop a plan with measurable outcomes that draws on the jail assessment and prevalence data and the examination of available treatment and service empacity, while considering identified burriers.

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Implement research-based approaches that advance the plan.

Create a process to track progress using data and information systems, and to report on
