Mr. Curtis assured Mr. Mack and Mr. Fortney that the road would be better than it was now and their final goal could still be achieved. He would work on the road himself. If he encountered problems, he would call them and they could discuss the situation.

Mr. Mack felt that it involved politics. Mr. Curtis said he would work with him to make it right. Mr. Mack and Mr. Fortney again said that nobody had called them. Mr. Curtis again said that the driver calls each customer to see if they are ready for their rock or makes a note as to when/where it should to be delivered. He had to get hold of someone or the rock was not delivered. This insured that the rock was delivered to the correct location. Mr. Fortney said the rock had not been applied properly. Mr. Curtis said the Road and Bridge Department would do their best to get it right. They had his word on it.

Mr. Mack concluded they had not seen improvement on their road - that's why they were here today.

Mr. Brawner stayed to discuss the transmission line proposed by the Ameren Mark Twain Transmission Project. He stated that an individual associated with Ameren was contacting property owners trying to get permission to access their property to determine easements. The individual associated with Ameren was attempting to get them to actually sign paperwork to accomplish this. There was also discussion that easements could also be including County roads.

The Commission stated that the project was currently on hold and property owners were not obligated to give permission to Ameren at this time to access their land.

Commissioner Adams moved to accept the Maintenance Agreement between Pro-Tech Co., Inc. and the Adair County Commission to provide maintenance and repair services to their copy machine. Presiding Commissioner Pickens seconded the motion. The agreement begins on 6/20/2016 and expires of 6/19/2017.

The Commission spent the rest of the day attending to County business.
