

**ADAIR COUNTY COMMISSION MINUTES
MONDAY, NOVEMBER 25, 2013
9TH DAY OCTOBER ADJOURNED**

The Adair County Commission convened at 8:30 a.m. on November 25, 2013 in the Courthouse at Kirksville. All Commissioners were present.

The Commission met with Adair County Assessor, Donnie Waybill, for the 2014 budget hearing for the assessor's office. His budget proposal was basically similar to that as last year with a few exceptions. It is anticipated that expenses for appraisal contracts outside of the County will be increasing due to Board of Equalization litigation. Mr. Waybill is again proposing an \$85,000 transfer from General Revenue to help offset the low parcel count reimbursement paid by the State. Adair County's parcel count currently is 14,710 parcels that will be reimbursed by the State of Missouri at \$3.00 each for a total revenue of \$44,130.00.

Mr. Waybill will return next week to propose employee salaries using the updated Adair County Salary Plan.

The Commission met with Ron Brewer of the Clark County Commission and Adair County Prosecuting Attorney, Matt Wilson, to discuss the situation with Multi County. Mr. Wilson stated that his office in Adair County could cover cases anywhere within Multi County's jurisdiction. He stated that he was the only full-time Prosecutor within the area and all other Prosecutors were part-time. John Moon, Prosecuting Attorney for Clark County, stated that Clark County wanted to keep the services within that county, but wanted the financial responsibility to remain in Adair County.

Mr. Wilson stated that he would be talking today with Diane Salsberry, Liaison for the Division of Family Services (DFS) for all counties served by Multi County. He wanted to clarify with Ms. Salsberry that the State of Missouri wanted the administration and the services of Multi County to be held within the same county

In the afternoon, Human Resource/Grant Writer, Beth Platz, presented her 2014 budget to the Commission. The budget was similar to that of 2013. Per the County Commission, Mrs. Platz's budget will reflect monies for a possible salary increase to Level 13, Step 4 of the Adair County Salary Plan.

The Commission spent the rest of the day attending to County business

The Adair County Commission adjourned at 4:00 p.m. on November 25, 2013.
