COUNTY OF ADAIR, MISSOURI

ORDINANCE NO. 2017-2

(Amended May 07, 2018)

An ordinance of the County of Adair, Missouri for stop intersections in accordance with Missouri Revised Statute 49.266;

WHEREAS, except when directed to proceed by a law enforcement officer, every driver of a vehicle approaching a stop intersection, indicated by a stop sign, shall stop at a clearly marked stop line; but

WHEREAS, if none, before entering the crosswalk on the near side of the intersection, or if none then at the point nearest the intersecting roadway where the driver has a view of approaching traffic in the intersecting roadway before entering the intersection; and

WHEREAS, after having stopped, the driver shall yield the right-of-way to any vehicle which has entered the intersection from another roadway or which is approaching so closely on the roadway as to constitute an immediate hazard during the time when such driver is moving across or within the intersection.

- 1. All stop intersections must be approved by the Adair County Commission.
- 2. No such stop intersection will be considered unless 12 signatures of residents residing in the township where the intersection is located, or unless the intersection is deemed as a hazard by the Sheriff of Adair County or the Adair County Commission. All stop intersections already in place prior to this ordinance being placed into effect are grandfathered in.
- 3. All stop intersections already in place prior to this ordinance being placed into effect are grandfathered in.

Approved stop intersections include:

- 1. Capri Way and Clemson Way
- 2. Patterson Way and Strawberry Way
- 3. Orrick Trail/Potter Trail
- 4. Potter Trail/Tamarack Trail
- 5. Potter Trail/Elmwood Trail

This Ordinance shall be in full force and in effect from and after its passage and adoption. Should any provision with the Ordinance be adjudged invalid, said determination shall not affect the validity of the balance of this Ordinance.
