

ADAIR COUNTY COMMISSION MINUTES
MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 28, 2015
24TH DAY JULY ADJOURNED

The Adair County Commission convened at 8:30 a.m. on September 28, 2015 in the Courthouse at Kirksville. All Commissioners were present.

The Commission attended the Court En Banc Meeting in the Adair County Circuit jury room located on the third floor of the Courthouse. Payment for equipment for mandated court e-filing was discussed.

The Commission was notified by Adair County Prosecuting Attorney, Matt Wilson, that the contested portion of Laske Trail would be treated as a County road. He also stated that any interruption to the use of said road would result in the Sheriff's department being contacted. Northeast Missouri Rural Telephone Company had experienced some interference by residents on Laske Trail in relation to the laying of fiber optics. If there is additional interference by the residents, then the appropriate phone call would be to the Sheriff's office. Mr. Wilson said Laske Trail would be maintained just like it would in any other case on a County road.

Adair County Clerk, Sandra Collop, reported that on Thursday, September 24, 2015, a bathroom key was delivered to Adair County Circuit Clerk, Linda Decker, per the August 6, 2015 Judgment from Honorable Gary Oxenhandler for Case No. 14AR-CV00603. She also reported that a check in the amount of \$57,306.13 and a check in the amount of \$205.00 in compliance with the same Judgment representing paragraph 3 and paragraph 5 respectfully was picked up by Judge Russell Steele from the Treasurer's Office on Friday, September 25, 2015. Judge Steele refused to sign a statement provided by the Treasurer for receipt of the check.

Commissioner Adams moved to amend the 2015 budget to reflect the above transactions for Case No. 14AR-CV00603 and the receipt and payment of phone bills to finalize the division of all phone expenses with the Second Judicial Circuit. Commissioner Thompson seconded the motion with all in favor. Revenue account 101-4-000-301.008 and expense account 101-5-015-200.200 (2nd Circuit Direct Bill) will both increase in the amount of \$2310. Expense account 101-5-015-300.000 (Adair 2014 Excess Distribution) will increase \$38,487.34 and expense account 101-5-020-300.000 (Court Reporter Mileage & Training) will be increased \$205.

Commissioner Adams then moved to amend the 2015 budget to reflect refunds from the CERF retirement system. Commissioner Thompson seconded the motion with all in favor. These refunds will be added to Assessment Fund 202-4-000-600.200 in the amount of \$4,000 and to the PA Admin Fund 903-4-000-600.100 in the amount of \$2,150.

At 3:30 p.m., the Commission and Adair County Clerk, Sandra Collop, met with City Officials in the Council Chambers at Kirksville City Hall. Present at the meeting were Kirksville City Manager, Mari Macomber; City Engineer, Len Kollars; City Council Members, Rick Steele, Phillip Biston, and Glen Moritz; E-911 representative, Chris Killday; and representatives from the Kirksville Daily Express and KTVO Television.

A water protection plan was discussed to protect the water sources out in the County. In order to apply for State and/or Federal funding a plan would need to be in place. Mr. Kollars discussed road erosion on Stokes Road and Hungry Hollow Road. He asked what work could be done in the ditches of these roads to keep sediment from coming down into the water source. He also discussed shoreline erosion. If issues were identified then they could be dealt with. The Commission felt that Adair County Road and Bridge Supervisor, Isaiah Curtis, could provide input into these situations.
