ADAIR COUNTY COMMISSION MINUTES MONDAY, AUGUST 30, 2021 13TH DAY JULY ADJOURNED

The Adair County Commission convened at 8:30 a.m. on August 30, 2021, in the Courthouse at Kirksville. All Commissioners were present.

At 1:40 p.m., the Commissioner met with Adair County Sheriff, Eldon Grissom; Administrative Section Chief/Financial Director, Danica Collinge; and Senior Detention Officer, John Axsom to discuss jail repairs. Mr. Axsom stated there are chunks missing from the railings for the pods. The railings are original from 2003. They contain woven material that is only tacked to the railing and cannot be welded. Prisoners work pieces loose and turn them into weapons. Mr. Axsom showed the Commission examples from 2014 and stated it has gotten extremely worse. One of the employees was attacked by one of these weapons. He sustained only minor injures as it did not puncture his body armor. It needs to be replaced.

Mrs. Collinge showed pictures of "C" pod . The railings are forty-two" high. She suggested a 4 X8 transparent solid panel be installed for "B" and "C" pods. The cost would be approximately \$10,313.33 and asked if this cost could be recouped using COVID funds. It can be cleaned and is durable. Sheriff Grissom discussed the safety issue. It is an ongoing problem as people are more violent now in their assaults. He also like the cleanability of the solid panels. The Commission agreed. Commissioner King said they should fix what they have now and then could go from there.

Mrs. Collinge also wanted to address the showers. She said they needed to be painted and retiled. The floors are deteriorating, and she wanted to replace them with finished concrete. Presiding Commissioner Shahan wants to use any available funds for long term projects. Perhaps the projects could be divided. Mrs. Collinge also spoke of marred windows, kicked out drywall, and destroyed sprinkler spickets.

The Commission thanked everyone for their information.

At 2:45 p.m., the Commission conducted a bid opening to install a 100-foot-long X 36-inch diameter culvert on Tamarac Trail. Adair County will provide all material.

Two bids were received: one from Lawson Construction, LLC in the amount of \$5,500 and the second from Willis Brothers Inc. in the amount of \$18,500. After discussion, Commissioner Thompson moved to award the bid to Lawson Construction, LLC. Commissioner King seconded the motion. Presiding Commissioner Shahan concurred. All voted in favor of the motion.

Presiding Commissioner Shahan signed an Engineering Services Agreement with Benton & Associates, Inc. for structural design services for replacement of the Adair County Courthouse elevator.

The Commission received a letter from Rouner Law Office. It was on behalf of landowners who adjoin the County roadways of Eagle Trail, Forgotten Trail, and Stukey Cemetery Trail as to the nature of County road ownership interest for the proposed Adair County solar project. The Adair County Commission adjourned at 4:00 p.m. on August 30, 2021.
